In John chapter 21, Jesus gave Simon Peter three charges regarding His sheep. These charges are now carried out by the pastors who serve our churches. Your pastor (Christ's under-shepherd) has the responsibility to feed and tend to you and the fellow members of your congregation. This feeding is grounded in the means of grace, His Word, and the sacraments. This feeding of His Word comes to us in their sermons and leading Bible studies. The pastor is also responsible for tending to the flock by providing Christ-like comfort and care.

In October, the LCMS has appointed two Appreciation Days—Pastors (13) and Deaconesses (25). With these two appreciation days, we can show appreciation for our pastors and deaconesses; this month is a time to thank God for the blessings of these two Callings.
