STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS: January 26 - Third Sunday after Epiphany 1

Cor. 12:16 – “And if the ear should say, ‘Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,’ that would not make it any less a part of the body.” The Lord has called each of us individually and given each of us unique gifts. He has made our whole lives holy in our Baptism and has called us to a life together in the church, His body. You are a part of that body, and that body needs you and the gifts the Lord has given you. This is your holy calling from the Lord.

A LIFE THOUGHT: January 26 – St. Titus, Pastor and Confessor – The Apostle Paul involved Gentile Titus in Christian ministry to embody how the Gospel doesn't discriminate. So confinement to mother's womb will not disqualify anyone from worth: Jesus is Lord there, too (Psalm 71:6). And advanced age cannot undermine it either: He employs “elder” as an expression of respect (Titus 1:5-9). We dare not close the kingdom doors Almighty God has opened!

Was it Mrs. Fox, or Mr. Locher? Pastor Watkins, or my friend Dave? Who was it that urged me to give prayer and consideration to serving as a full-time church worker? It was all of them, and many more. And when I was younger, I gave them ample reasons to think I wouldn't be a pastor. But still, the Lord used many people of the Central Illinois District in the 70s and 80s to nudge and form me into a pastor.

The Lord works through means, and sometimes it's you He uses. Think about the maturing Christian men and women (they don't have to be youth) in your congregation whom you could encourage to serve as a Lutheran teacher, musician, or pastor. Pray first, encourage second.

[Jesus said,] “Therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest.” (Mt 9:38). The fields are His, and the work is His. He will hear and answer your prayers according to His will. You *might* be encouraging the wrong person, but He'll work His will. Pray first. Encourage second. That's a good way to begin the year of our Lord 2025.

Trinity Lutheran Church, Pekin, will host the Small Church Summit (SCS) meeting on February 22. The bad weather date is March 1.

Sign-in starts at 9:30 a.m. Opening devotion will commence at 10:00. Adjournment will be at 2:30 that afternoon.

Before lunch, a presentation on Witnessing Helps (that can be found online at <https://www.cidlcms.org/outreach-witness-ministry.html>). Copies of the four Witnessing Helps sheets on 1) beginning an evangelistic conversation, 2) listening discerningly to a nonchurched person, 3) making a simple statement of the Gospel, and 4) defending the resurrection will be provided at the SCS.

Lunch will be provided. In the afternoon, interest sessions will include:

- Further conversation about the Witnessing Helps
- A session with Mr. Trip Rodgers of CID staff on various available resources
- A session with CID President Michael Mohr on record-keeping in smaller churches, especially during pastoral vacancies
