FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK - JANUARY 2022



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

As you read this we will have just come through Advent, celebrated the Nativity of our Lord, and are just a few days from the Feast of the Epiphany. The focus of Advent and Christmastide is the Incarnation.

During Advent, we focus on the necessity of the Incarnation. We think about our sad plight, but then we hear the promises culminating in the Annunciation (which we also celebrate on March 25—nine months before Christmas Day). The morning before we celebrate with candles the birth of the Christ, the Church celebrates and reads these words:

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:18-21).

As Advent prepares us, we learn of a Son conceived in Mary's womb. Like you and me, our Lord was conceived. He became a son.

As we turn to the Nativity, we then hear these words: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). On Christmas morning we learn that the Word—God—became flesh. And then He, in the flesh, dwelt among us. God came to us! He came to us as us!

I often let my thoughts wander as I think about that. I'm fairly certain I've preached on those wanderings once or twice. What was it like on the night He was born? Did wolves howl and shooting stars dance? Did Creation react to its time of rescue finally dawning? I wonder, did a person's hair stand up, or a chill run down the spine as He bumped into you on the street? Imagine that: the creature having a casual chance encounter with its Creator on a bustling, dusty, Galilean street. That alone is a theological point I could opine on at some length, but I will restrain myself except for this: The God of the Universe saw fit to walk and live among us as one of us.

You see, Advent prepares us for God to be among us, and Christmas presents us with the gift we have been prepared to receive. And this is such very good news. God came to us as us.

Christ, fully God and fully man. As an enfleshed—that is incarnate—human being, your God and mine knows by firsthand experience exactly what you experience in your life. All your emotions, temptations, and simple human things like tiredness and hunger—all these are not only known by our Lord, but they were experienced by Him too. Your life, indeed all life, was that valuable and precious to Him.

There's a point worth pondering. Christ experienced *all* aspects of humanity. He was conceived. He, in His own conception, sanctified life in the womb. He lived as a baby in the womb of His mother. We would do well to remember that. As He lived as yet unborn, He declared that phase of our lives holy. Life in the womb is holy. We too need regard it as such.

Life is not to be thrown away willy-nilly to satisfy our cravings, our expectations, and our desires. It is be cherished, upheld, and defended. Life, in all its stages has been held so worthy by God that He would experience in His body all of it. We should too. And this, of course, goes beyond the womb. We are surrounded by those who our culture deems less worthy of life. The horrible argument moves along these lines: they are destined to a life of (the possibility) of poverty, (the possibility) of crime, so let's kill them before they can ever taste the air outside the womb. Those who offer such arguments would do well to remember that our Lord often had no place to rest His head and was not found living a life of ease and comfort. No, He was born to a decidedly humble family and lived the life of a nomad—often chased from one town to the next. All this while completing the work of redeeming ALL life. All life was and is worthy of redemption. This remains true even if it doesn't live up to our "standards."

The Incarnation is about so much more than presents under our trees. It's about the very nature and worth of all of our lives. All life was redeemed by Christ. All life was sanctified in His body, in His life. All life is a gift. And all life is deemed so precious by our Creator that He would endure all of it—from conception to death. And beyond—to our resurrections.

Advent, Christmas, and the Epiphany teach us this as we creatures receive the Christ. And so we sing with *all* the heavenly host:

"Glory to God in the highest,

and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"

--Luke 2:14.

A blessed Christmastide and Epiphany to all of you!

Over the course of time, QC Haven of Hope has transitioned through a rebranding, expanded connections within the community, and made changes to increase our capacity for housing homeless women and children. Sprouted from absolute need within our community, this mission has persevered over the span of years thanks to the engagement of our organizational leaders, our volunteers, our devoted supporters and a caring community. As we focus on the future and ways to enhance and expand homeless services, another change is underway. **QC Haven of Hope is excited to announce its women and children's shelter will become a part of Christian Care. Christian Care is a not-for-profit organization located in Rock Island which has served our homeless community for more than 105 years. They, and we, are extremely proud that they will be able to continue serving the local community with the addition of a women and children's shelter. Under the direction of Christian Care's Executive Director, Frank Roe and his Board of Directors, this new team will continue serving the critical needs of homeless women and children.**



'Tis More Blessed to Give Than to Receive

"In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' " (Acts 20:35)

And indeed, it is. Does this not strike a chord that resonates in us all? Which of us can't recall the look of surprise and thanks for the Christmas gifts that we labored to give to those whom we love? And the joy written on their face when that gift is received with thanksgiving means more than all the gifts we have received. It is more blessed to give than to receive.

Our Lord knew this because He practiced it. He gave of Himself – sparing not even His life in death – in order to give us back to our Father in heaven. He knew that in giving you get more because joy is multiplied in giving. The one who receives and the one who gives both rejoice in what is given and received. And, what is more, the one who receives only wants to give back to the one who gave so generously in thanksgiving.

So it is with our tithes and offerings in church. We want to give because we have received from God all that we are and all that we have. Our giving does not originate in what we must do to earn God's favor. We have God's favor because of His gift of His Son, given through Word and Sacrament. Thus, we are made free from the compulsion of giving so that our tithes and offering are freely given in thanksgiving for what God has so generously given to us.

Why then does the church struggle to make budgets? Why does the church always seem stretched so thin when it is the place where God continually gives us His forgiveness of sins? Why does the church struggle when God, out of love for us, generously pours out His grace and mercy?

It is because we are sinners. Our fallen nature makes us selfish and miserly. It leads us to believe that we can have our cake and eat it, too. Because of sin, we want God's grace and mercy; we want His blessings of body and soul. But we don't want to share it with those around us. We want to remain comfortable in our own self-contained, neat, and tidy lives – without the headaches of loving those around us by helping them in their time of need.

"Remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'" Remember that God has placed you in a church, not only to receive His grace and mercy, but to press His eternal and temporal blessings into service to your neighbor.

Your tithes and offerings ensure that those around you have a pastor to preach the life-saving and life-giving Word of God. They ensure that the lights, heat, and air-conditioning are working. They ensure there is water for Holy Baptism as well as bread and wine for Holy Communion. They even ensure that your pastor has food and clothing and presents for his own family. The gifts of God are immeasurable. They multiply and redound to everyone's good as the fish and loaves in the feeding of the five thousand.

So, remember the words of the Lord Jesus: "It is more blessed to give than to receive." And remember the joy that attended the gifts you gave at Christmas. This same joy attends your gifts to the church.

Several Bible texts condemn practices such as astrology, talking with spirits, palm reading, astral letters, etc. (Lev. 19:26, 20:27, Deut. 18:10). Ezekiel 18:21-22 says: "But if a wicked person turns away from all the sins they have committed and keeps all my decrees and does what is just and right, that person will surely live; they will not die. When you dismay or when your strength is gone, He promises to help you and never leave your side. My prayer for each one of you is that 2022 will find you in the presence of God with Christ in your heart and in the hearts of your loved ones.
